



In recent weeks, there has been widespread discussion about the health effects of Bisphenol-A. In some instances single serving bottled water images and products have been incorrectly referenced as a product containing Bisphenol-A. In response, we have had a number of calls from concerned customers and would like to provide clarification. Nestlé Waters Canada's single serve plastic bottles are made from Polyethylene (PET) plastic and contain no Bisphenol-A. PET plastic bottles are identified by the recycling symbol "1" located on the bottom of the bottle.

PET plastic is considered safe by the regulatory agencies governing bottled water, including Health Canada, the US Food and Drug Administration, and is in line with World Health Organization guidelines. Plastic bottles with the symbol "1" are made from PET.

Key facts about Nestlé Waters Canada's bottled water:

- Bottles that have a number "1" on the bottom are made from PET. PET does not contain Bisphenol-A.
- Nestlé Waters Canada is continually re-evaluating our bottles to ensure they meet or exceed the safety standards of international regulatory and public health agencies, are easily recycled and are convenient for our customers.
- We encourage people, when they have finished consuming all plastic products, to properly recycle.
- Our 500 millilitre "Eco-Shape" bottle, introduced in 2007, is among the lightest in beverage history, reducing the plastic in our bottles by 15%. Our new bottle feels different, and we believe consumers appreciate the lower plastic resin content. This new bottle design is being introduced to all of our brands in North America and will save approximately 30 million kilograms of plastic resin a year.
